

Public Transport Directions: Both bus 10A and tramway 41 have a stop, "Türkenschanzpark", this will bring you to the bottom left entrance (Lounge Gersthoff), then make your way to the spot identified by a yellow star Direction by car: From the Wahringer Gürzle, turn noto Wahringer straße (not on the side of the Volksoper, on the other side), continue on this street and turn right at Gersthofer Straße, you wil meet the Hasenauertraße, turn right and try to find parking on this street.

Michael Crummey

Canadian poet and writer (Newfoundland and Labrador)

Michael Crummey was born in the mining town of Buchans, Newfoundland, growing up there and in Wabush, a Labrador mining town near the Quebec border. After high school he attended Memorial University of Newfoundland, then moved to Ontario to pursue graduate work in English Literature. He has been a full-time writer for the past 15 years. He moved home to Newfoundland in 1999 and now lives in St. John's with his wife and family.

Michael Crummey has published ten books of poetry and fiction and has written for television and film. His first novel, *River Thieves*, was a finalist for the Giller Prize and won the Atlantic Fiction Prize. *Galore* won the Canadian Authors' Association Fiction Award, the Commonwealth Prize (Canada & Caribbean Region), and was shortlisted for the International IMPAC Dublin Award. *Sweetland* was a national bestseller and a finalist for the Governor-General's and Winterset Awards. His fiction has been published in the United States, the UK, France, Holland, Poland, and Italy. *Little Dogs: New and Selected Poems* was published by House of Anansi in the spring of 2016.

At the 13th Annual Graduate Conference of the Association for Canadian Studies in German-Speaking Countries, Michael Crummey will read short pieces from his newly released *Little Dogs: New and Selected Poems* as well as several short passages from his latest novel, *Sweetland*.

The reading will take place on June 25, 2016 18:00 at the Department of Romance Studies of the University of Vienna.
